We had 131 attendees join us at the Pilot School on Saturday, February 11. We opened with Keynote, Kathy McGlauflin, Executive Vice President of <u>Project Learning Tree</u> (PLT). She spoke about some of the initiatives PLT has going on nationally as well as online tools to use with students such as <u>i-Tree</u>. We then held our business meeting and elected board members, Trish Gerken, Dr. Dean Goodwin, Claire Mickletz, Rick Mickowski, Cathy Perrotto, and Maggie Pletta. Welcome new/returning board! Conference attendees then broke into their different sessions some of which included Project Learning Tree, Climate Change 101, Nature Play, Nature Journaling and more. After a boxed lunch and some

networking with colleagues, some attendees met to go on a field trip to Enchanted Woods at Winterthur Estate. "The garden is amazing, just like a fairy tale", one attendee commented. Others stayed at the Pilot School to attend a variety of sessions including BioBlitz, Technology, Digital Storytelling, Managing Animals, and some had a chance to see the Delaware Children Museum's inflatable earth. As the afternoon progressed, and silent auction bidding was building up, attendees went for the last breakout session of the day. I really enjoyed laughing at Laughter Yoga, others attended sessions on Children in Nature, Ecology, Hands on Gardening and Developing Outreach Strategies. We ended the day with a celebration cake and Keynote, Phung Luu from <u>Animal Behavior and Conservation Connections</u> speaking about his success with conservation initiatives through working with his birds. Mini-Grant Awarded to the Monarch Educator's Workshop

The Monarch Educator's Workshop is a well-established partnership between local teachers, Delaware State Parks, Delaware Nature Society, New Castle County Master Gardeners, Friends of Wilmington Parks, Delaware ForestService, and US Fish and Wildlife Service. This professional development workshop introduces educators to an inquiry based science curriculum that incorporates environmental

education, language arts enrichment, and cultural awareness using the monarch butterfly as a common thread. One of the major goals of the workshop is the establishment or improvement of schoolyard butterfly gardens. This not only creates habitats for monarchs, but provides experiential education for students, and helps them develop a sense of environmental stewardship.

The workshop provides participants with the materials and tools needed to immediately implement the curriculum. We strive to provide this workshop to educators free of charge.

DAEE Expanding Audiences Conference Scholarship.

DAEE introduces an Expanding Audiences Conference Scholarship

A strategic goal of the Delaware Association for Environmental Education (DAEE) is to increase the number of members who represent and/or educate underrepresented minorities including, but not limited to: people of color, indigenous people, island people, international communities, and English-language learners. In 2016, the DAEE Board decided to establish a program to recruit and assist individuals from groups underrepresented in science, or those who serve underrepresented or underserved audiences, to help facilitate the realization of that goal. The intent is to support qualified individuals to share their expertise, experiences and perspectives through active participation in DAEE Annual Conferences and the creation of a product that will benefit the larger environmental education community.

The 2017 scholarship recipient was Keisha Scovens, co-founder of Let's Go Outdoors (LGO). LGO is a fast-growing outdoor focused social enterprise, as well as a certified minority business located in Cheltenham, PA, though primarily serving constituents in the Philadelphia, PA area. LGO's mission is to inspire an appreciation of the outdoors, especially in those that live in urban communities and/or are predominately people-of-color.

Keisha was not able to join us at the 2017 conference, so her scholarship was deferred to the 2018 conference, when we will welcome DAEE's first **TWO** scholarship recipients!

May 20, 2017 – MADE CLEAR Climate Change Solutions Workshop

Chesapeake College Eastern Shore Higher Education Center, Wye Mills, MD The free workshop is open to classroom and informal educators and administrators in Delaware and Maryland, and is designed to help you teach about climate change. A basic understanding of climate change will be helpful; session-specific background material will be provided.

July 13, 2017 – Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency

Participants will receive content, resources, and hands-on learning about renewable energy and steps towards energy efficiency, in the shadow of UD's 2-megawatt wind turbine. Scientist are now using a host of autonomous and semi-autonomous systems to collect data on land, in the air, and in the water. One Sea Grant project is measuring changes to beaches due to coastal storms, using aerial drones, autonomous kayaks, and other robotics. Data collected from these systems are then used to evaluate changes in beach width and slope, sediment structure, and vegetation. Learn how these systems operate, and help the researchers collect more data. Clock hours will be awarded. Free for middle and high school teachers and informal educators from Delaware (others will be considered).
